Switchpoint Community Soup Kitchen Serving for Christmas

Over the past year, the Switchpoint Community Soup Kitchen has served over 32,500 meals and logged 14,268 volunteer hours. And for the fourth year in a row, in partnership with the Elks, the Switchpoint Community Soup Kitchen will be serving a Christmas meal at the Elks Lodge.

"The turn out in year's past has been wonderful and we are expecting around 350+ people who may not be able to afford a Christmas meal to join us. There will be live music, a Santa and gifts on hand for the children thanks to Toys for Tots," said Donna McBean, a volunteer at the Switchpoint Community Soup Kitchen and coordinator of the event.

"This event is only possible because of the volunteers who so generously give of their time and energy, not only on Christmas day but in the weeks leading up to the planned meal," said Sheila Broadhead, Switchpoint Community Soup Kitchen Manager.

"We at Switchpoint are continually blown away by the generosity and giving nature of our community. Switchpoint is so proud to be a part of this program which strives every day to ease the burden of hunger for the most vulnerable in our community, " stated Broadhead.

Switchpoint Named Innovator of the Year

ST. GEORGE — Switchpoint Community Resource Center received the Innovator of the Year award at the 15th Annual Homelessness Summit held in Salt Lake City on October 25, 2018.

Written by Mori Kessler, St. George News, November 10, 2018 Each year, the Utah Department of Workforce Services, Housing and Community Development Division recognizes individuals and organizations for their efforts in serving people who are experiencing homelessness. Those recognized have demonstrated going beyond standard practices to help people make a positive change in their lives.

Switchpoint Homeless

Shelter and Community Resource Center was chosen for providing more than just emergency beds and meals for people.

"Switchpoint operates 24/7 and takes an

individual approach with each person who walks through their doors," reads a statement from the center. "There are no handouts at Switchpoint; everyone is expected to earn the things they need by doing their part and taking care of the facility.

As you might imagine, most of our homeless neighbors don't have their own vehicles. In order to keep an appointment to see their children's physician for a sick visit or to keep an interview appointment, they rely entirely on public transportation. To help these folks get to important places, you can give a one month buss pass to a thankful person.



Welcome Home Kit—Donation \$285

You've finally gotten the key to your own place—one you can actually afford. But where will you get the money for the basics: towels, dishes, silverware, glasses, pots and pans? Help a formerly homeless family turn a new apartment into a real home.

Showers & Rest for Family of 4



Each month, Switchpoint spends hundreds of dollars to run the water, stock the soap and shampoo, and launder towels, sheets and blankets in our shelter. Help us provide a clean, comfortable haven for a family, individual or veteran in transition.

Feed 4 Families for a Month



Donation \$500

Homeless individuals are beyond hungry; they're also malnourished and unhealthy. Food isn't the complete solution; healthy, nutritionally balanced meals are. Treat 4 families to good breakfasts and dinners for an entire month and give the gifts of food and health.



Replacing Identification -Donation \$125

Families who are homeless often have had to leave possessions behind or have unfortunate events happen. This means that most are without basic identification, birth certificates needed to gain employment and housing. Help a family on the road to self-reliance with the gift of identification.



Be a Hero—Donation \$1,225

Electricity, heat, water, sewer, and personnel: without these behindthe-scenes basics, not a single homeless individual could live in our emergency shelter. Be a hero keep our shelter ready to welcome families transitioning from homelessness to hopefulness. "Remember you can also donate by supporting the businesses that help support Switchpoint.

The Switchpoint Thrift Store and Bed 'n' Biscuits Dog Daycare both help Switchpoint by providing necessary funding that goes directly to help those families experiencing homelessness ."
